The Cyberspace Law & Policy Centre* is holding a one day Symposium to discuss the Australian Law Reform Commission's *Report on Privacy*, which will have been tabled in Parliament by September, and will take stock of the NSW Law Reform Commission's privacy review, papers from which should also be available.

The theme of the Symposium will be to consider how well the ALRC and NSWLRC proposals meet a number of current privacy challenges, including:

- Providing a set of Privacy Principles that set a new global standard
- Building consumer trust in electronic commerce
- Meeting international standards to facilitate appropriate cross border data transfers
- Delivering effective enforcement of privacy rules and remedies for breaches
- Limiting the growth of a surveillance society
